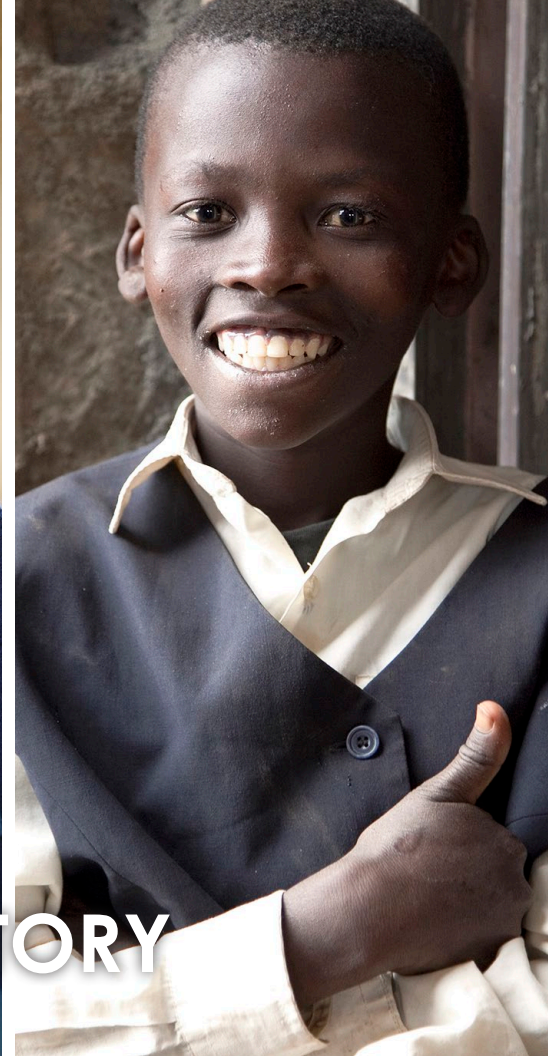

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3 DAVID'S STORY

David's Hope International is named for David, a boy we met on the steps of an abandoned farmhouse on a mountainside overlooking Kenya's Great Rift Valley. **He and his family are the inspiration for our cause.**

David was a child, plucked out of a crowd of ever-present, curious children following us. Our host, a local pastor, used David to physically illustrate the effects that chronic malnourishment and poverty were having on local children. David was not cared for, did not bathe, likely had no regular place to sleep, and subsisted on just one meager meal a day. His story caught our hearts, just as his sister's story had influenced the pastor years earlier. David's younger sister, Mary, lost her battle to hunger, prompting the pastor and his wife to begin their ministry and feeding program in Eburru.

We returned from our trip determined not to let the story of David & Mary repeat itself. We wanted to give David, and children like him, lasting hope for a brighter future.

TODAY, DAVID LIVES IN THE CBM ORPHANAGE WHERE HE RECEIVES THREE MEALS A DAY, CLOTHING, AND A FIRST-RATE EDUCATION AT THE CBM CHRISTIAN SCHOOL. HE ALSO ATTENDS THE LOCAL CHURCH.

- Two meals a day for the school feeding program have also been administered consistently throughout the year as well as the school academic program.
- Through the conviction of our faith in Christ, discipleship programs have been reenergized in our Churches, school and the orphanage. The pastors, teachers, and DHI missionaries have all blessed this work in a big way.
- The Camp Brethren Medical Center continues compassionately with the ministry of healing. They have consistently offered the following services to the entire community: curative outpatient services, prenatal care, family planning, growth monitoring and promotion, HIV counseling and testing, and immunization services.

May God bless all those who have stood with Camp Brethren and David's Hope International. We sincerely thank God for all those who have prayed, supported and encouraged us.

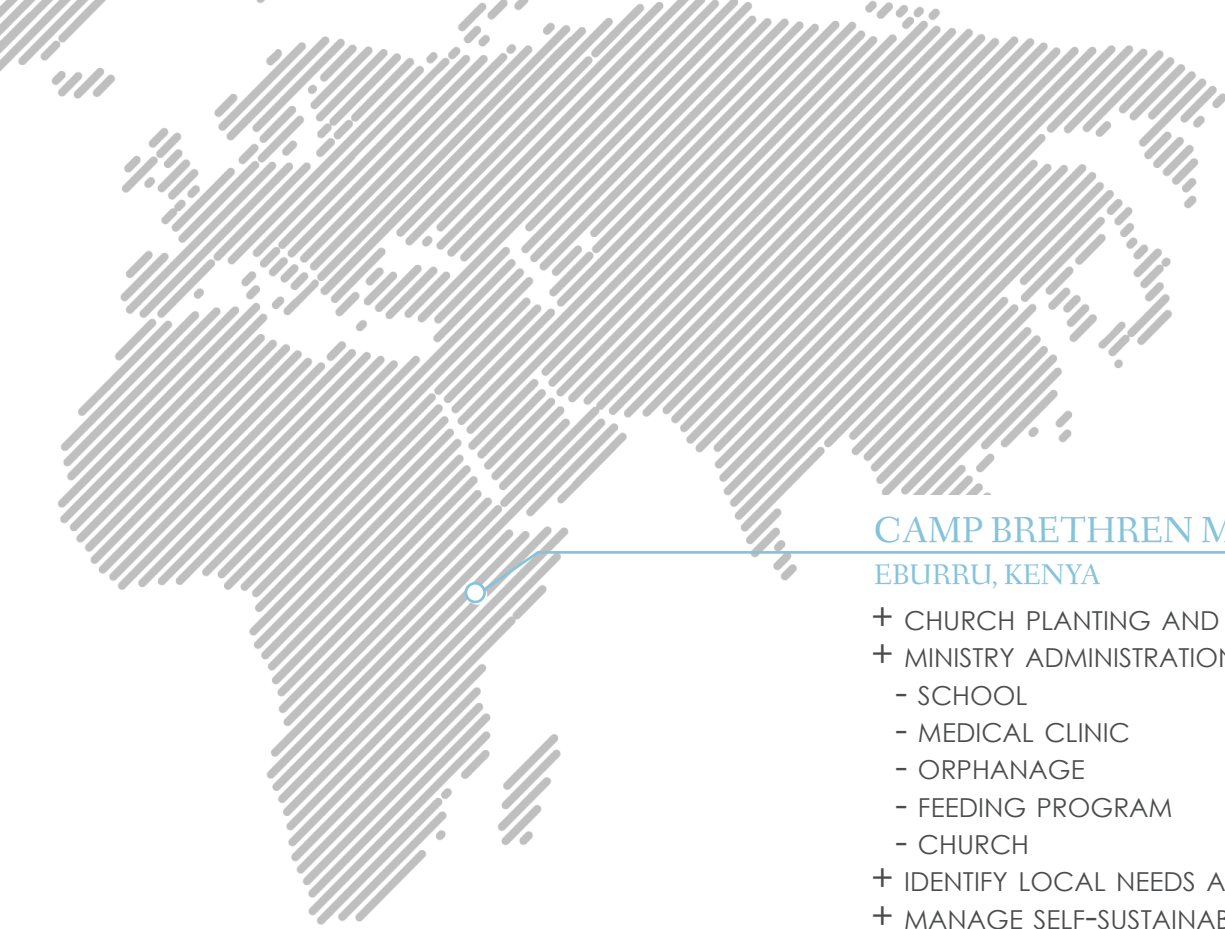

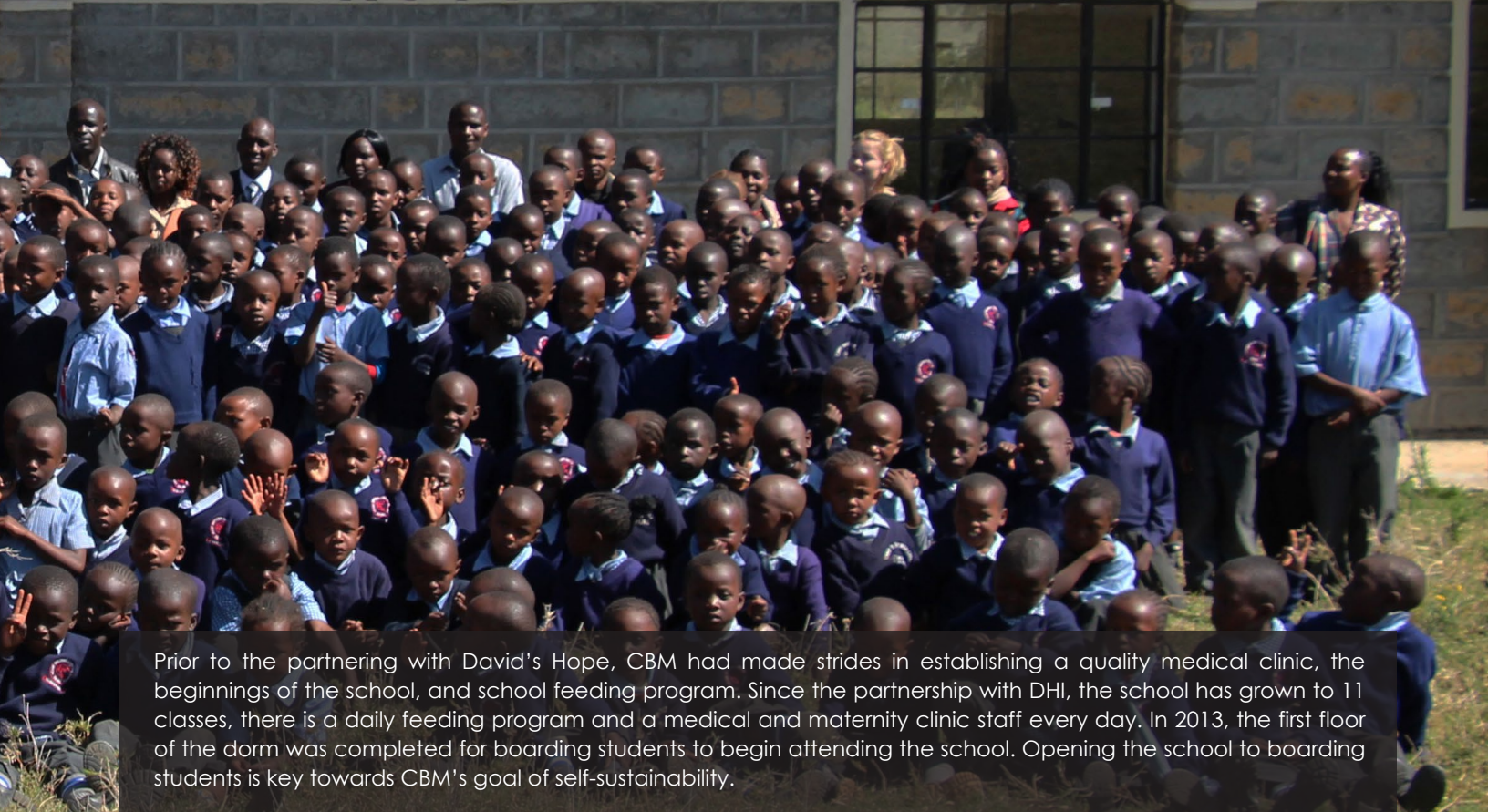

SCHOOL MOTTO:- TO LEAD AND TO SERVE



Prior to the partnering with David's Hope, CBM had made strides in establishing a quality medical clinic, the beginnings of the school, and school feeding program. Since the partnership with DHI, the school has grown to 11 classes, there is a daily feeding program and a medical and maternity clinic staff every day. In 2013, the first floor of the dorm was completed for boarding students to begin attending the school. Opening the school to boarding students is key towards CBM's goal of self-sustainability.



2013 Update

In addition to providing immediate and lasting advancements in the community, education is a practical way to meet the emotional, nutritional, and spiritual needs of the children on a daily basis. Quality education in Eburru was out of reach for many of the children in the community. As a result, in January 2010, the Camp Brethren Christian School (CBCS) opened and began educating some of the youngest and the neediest in Eburru. In 2013, nine class levels were taught: three-year old preschool, four-year old preschool, kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 7th.

In early 2014, sixth and eighth grade will be added. Adding an 8th grade will prepare our first group of students to take the national secondary placement exam. Scores on this exam will be a barometer for the quality of education received at the school and will be important for marketing CBCS going forward. By the end of 2014, David's Hope plans to complete construction of four final classrooms so there will be two classrooms each for grades four through eight.



231 students completed the 2013 school year of which 11 were tuition paying boarding students.



Classes, which use the Kenya Ministry of Education curriculum, meet from 9am to 4pm, January through December.



Subjects include: Math, English, Swahili, Social Science, Religious Education, Crafts, Physical Education and Special Studies (such as hygiene and agriculture).



PROGRAMS | FEEDING

2013 Update

The feeding program at the Camp Brethren Christian School (CBCS) is designed to provide every student with two well-balanced meals. Each day, students receive a morning porridge and lunch prepared in the onsite kitchen. With the number of students fed daily exceeding 230 in 2013, it was critical to have access to fresh water. The 2011 funding of a hydro-thermal solution and the 2012 construction of a 500,000 liter water tank allowed CBCS to be prepared for the increased demands of adding new students in 2013.



Common meals are stew-like and may include beans, potatoes, cabbage, spinach and rice.



Two cooks provide meals for nearly 300 students plus faculty and staff twice each day.



In addition to the school-day meals, dinner and weekend meals are provided for the 40 children in the orphanage and boarding student dorm.



2013 Update

Life in Eburru affects families differently. Educational needs, medical needs, and food security are three very obvious areas of need and Camp Brethren Ministry has begun addressing each of these. After spending the last several years in the community, Pastor Steve and his wife Mary discovered an additional need that some children face: a safe, nurturing living environment. Due to extreme conditions, some children lack the necessary home environment that will help them grow properly. These are not orphans by the typical definition but rather children who have parents that are not able to properly care for them. As a result, Camp Brethren Ministry has established an orphanage.

The orphanage was opened in September 2011 with 12 children. By the end of 2012 there were 18 children living in the orphanage. In 2013, the children's home neared full capacity with 23 children. There are separate boys and girls dorm rooms and most of the children living in the orphanage attend the Camp Brethren Christian School next door. Each of these children benefit from having a safe, clean living environment, three meals a day and adult supervision.



Children are provided all their basic necessities (including three meals per day, clothing, school uniforms, etc.).

Dorm parents live on campus and provide parental guidance for the children after school and during weekends.



Children living in the orphanage and the tuition paying boarding students are largely integrated together and live as one intermingled group.




2013 Update

When CBM first came to Eburru, there was limited medical care for the community. Since opening the Camp Brethren Clinic in 2007, people in and around Eburru have been receiving high quality medical care and treatment. The CBM clinic has helped by providing a range of medical services to the local community. The 10-bed maternity ward supports mothers during the birthing process and provides immediate and ongoing care for newborns. The clinic also has a lab and a pharmacy.

Camp Brethren Ministry has seen a significant need for medical services in remote towns around Eburru, such as Turkana, where locals are unable to travel to the Eburru clinic. As a result, CBM has established a bi-weekly mobile clinic that travels out to Turkana via truck and delivers vaccinations to children and critical care to all ages. Through both the mobile outreach and full time staffing of the Eburru clinic, the number of patients treated continues to increase year over year.

PROGRAMS | MEDICAL



The mobile clinic treats about 70-80 patients each time it travels to the village of Turkana.

The clinic is staffed by one full-time nurse, a lab technologist, two part-time nurses and treats over 4,000 patients annually.

In 2013, the clinic assisted with 39 births. Due to the effectiveness of the nurses to properly triage life-threatening situations, there have been no still births since the maternity ward opened over four years ago.



2013 Update

In addition to helping provide for the immediate needs of those living in Eburru, David's Hope is promoting and implementing projects that will generate revenue for CBM's ministries and lower operating costs. Together with CBM, we have defined self-sustainability as the ability of the ministry to support itself without requiring donations and assistance from outside the Eburru community. Our intention is to avoid creating a dependence on donations. Our long-term goal is that investments in capital infrastructure coupled with the ministry's business initiatives will allow for the self-sufficiency of CBM.

Early investments in support of the sustainability model focused around agriculture. In 2013, tuition-paying boarding students began attending Camp Brethren Christian School, which is an important component to advancing the mission of self-sustainability. Additionally, plans are in development for on-campus sewing business to earn additional revenue and cut down on costs of replacement uniforms.



Two acres of fertile farmland provide fresh vegetables for the feeding program.



Infrastructure investments in bio-fuel and clean running water have aided in making CBM more self-sustaining.

The school dorm provides housing for tuition-paying boarding students and a new revenue stream to help promote future self-sustainability.

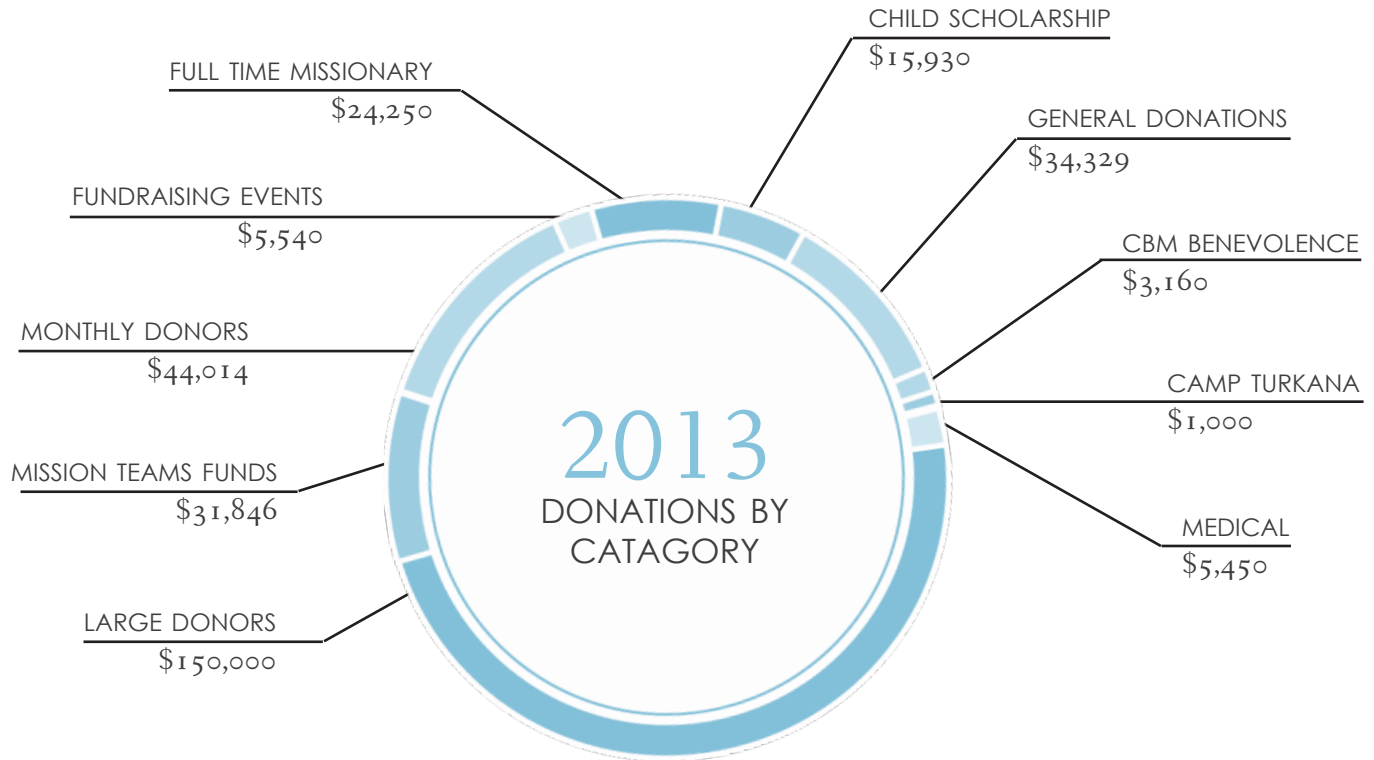


FUNDRAISING HIGHLIGHTS

LARGE DONORS OPEN THE DOOR TO SUSTAINABILITY

In 2013, David's Hope continued to reap the benefits of Executive Director Scott Sweat's 2012 recognition as the Investment News Invest in Others Global Community Service Advisor of the Year. God opened the hearts of several people who had been in attendance at the award ceremony and in April of 2013, one donor made a \$50,000 contribution and offered a second \$50,000 for a 90-day matching campaign. Our faithful friends and many new donors rallied and met the match, allowing us to complete several projects and break ground on a two-story dormitory for boarding students. Paying boarders are key to the school's sustainability plans.

Child sponsorship remains a major initiative of David's Hope. The goal is to provide tuition, school uniforms, shoes, medical care, and two nutritious meals each school day to every student in the school through the funding provided by monthly donors.

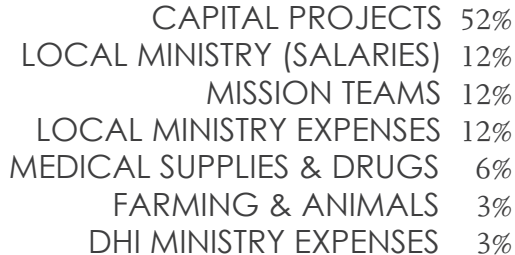
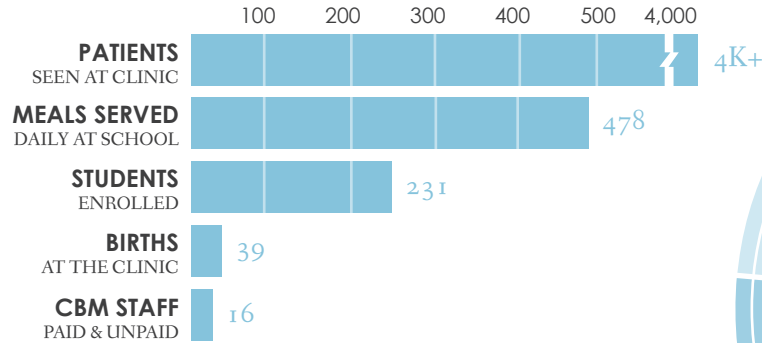

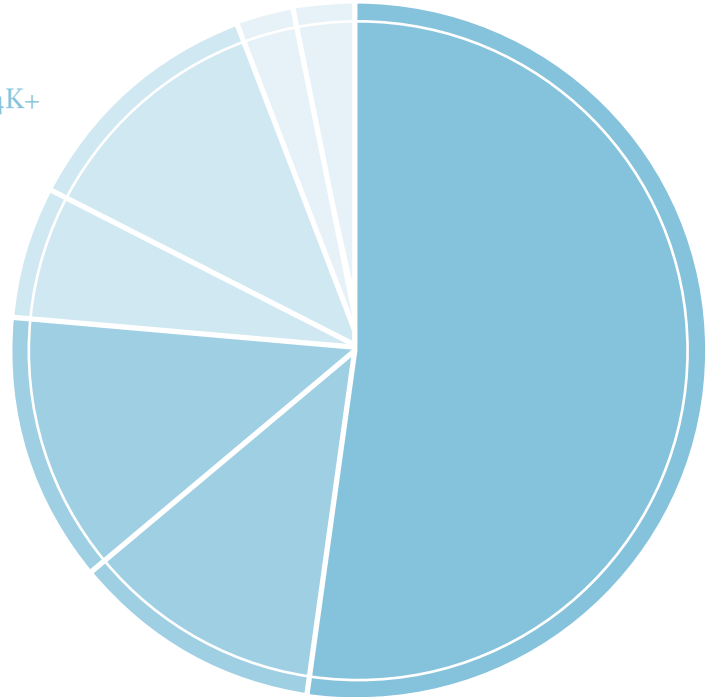

MAJOR PROJECTS

2013 PROJECTS FUNDED & COMPLETED

- Constructed the framework for the two-story, 250 student dorm (one of the few two story buildings in Eburru). The interior will be completed in 2014.
- Constructed three new classrooms.
- Began construction on new teacher quarters.
- Outfitted the CBM ministry huts with a bathroom including a toilet, shower and running water.
- Purchased new microscope for the medical lab and a baby warmer for the maternity ward.
- Purchased textbooks for the school and clothing for the orphanage.



PROJECT HIGHLIGHT

BOARDING STUDENT DORMITORY

Thanks to several large donors and numerous others, in 2013 we broke ground on the Boarding School Dormitory. The two-story dorm, when finished, will be able to house 250 students. By the end of December, one wing of the first floor was complete and 40 new students arrived to start the new school year. Both floors of the dormitory are expected to be finished by the end of 2014.

This project is the largest that David's Hope and Camp Brethren have launched together to date. One of the many ways God provided for efficient and cost-effective construction of the dorm was access to the 500,000 liter water reservoir, highlighted in last year's annual report. The water held in the reservoir provided a continuous source for making bricks and cement with no need to purchase outside water. This was a big answer to prayer for this very dry and remote village and another example of how God provides so faithfully.
